

THE LITERACY COOPERATIVE ADDRESSES LOW LITERACY IN GREATER CLEVELAND BY BRIDGING CURRENT GAPS IN THE EDUCATION CONTINUUM; ENSURING CHILDREN AND ADULTS IN GREATER CLEVELAND REACH THEIR HIGHEST LITERACY POTENTIAL FOR EMPLOYMENT, SELF-SUFFICIENCY, AND LIFELONG LEARNING.

2-GEN APPROACH

Two-generation delivery models focus on creating opportunities for and addressing needs of both children and the adults in their lives together. This approach recognizes that families come in all different shapes, sizes, and generations. Led by The Literacy Cooperative, a dedicated working committee of professionals, representing human service, workforce development, early childhood, and adult educational organizations, are executing a plan to demonstrate and promote 2Gen policy, practices, and programs

DOLLY PARTON'S IMAGINATION LIBRARY (DPIL)

The Literacy Cooperative is the lead affiliate for DPIL in Cuyahoga County. This wonderful book gifting initiative mails high-quality, brand new, age-appropriate books to enrolled children every month from birth until five years of age. Survey results indicate that since DPIL enrollment, children want to read more often and parents are reading more frequently with their children. An analysis conducted by CWRU showed a positive relationship between DPIL participation and kindergarten readiness with 59.8% of children who participated in DPIL scoring as "On-Track" Language & Literacy versus 45.8% of those not enrolled in DPIL. **Since 2014, DPIL has gifted more than 900,000 books to over 48,000 children in Cuyahoga County.**

PROFESSIONAL EXCELLENCE

The Literacy Cooperative offers a diverse menu of free trainings for literacy practitioners, volunteer tutors, and other cross-sector professionals. The three focus areas of early literacy, two-generation delivery, and career pathways are reflected in training offerings that cover best practices and relevant issues in a hands-on, participatory approach. Training sessions provide an important opportunity for dialogue, networking, and exposure to new ideas and strategies from experts in the field. The Literacy Cooperative is committed to ongoing availability of high-quality, literacy-centered professional development for practitioners and administrators.

CAREER PATHWAY ENGAGEMENT

The Literacy Cooperative convenes adult educators, workforce development professionals, employers, literacy funders, and adult learners to understand the literacy issues present in our community. Through our convening we bring consensus and solutions to address their needs as well as develop and evaluate shared measures. We provide continuous communications among partners regarding promising practices and evidence-based curricula, and reinforce and advocate for policy and system change to advance literacy levels in our community.



DR. JOHN S. HUTTON, MD, MS



Keynote speaker, Dr. John S. Hutton, MD, MS, is a pediatrician and clinical researcher at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center and "SpokesDoctor" for Read Aloud 15 Minutes. He has published 29 children's books, many with health-promoting themes, including screen time reduction, dialogic reading, reading to babies, infant calming, safe sleep, breastfeeding, ADHD, and how the heart works. His books have been adopted in statewide public health campaigns and distributed to millions of families with proceeds benefiting non-profit advocacy groups. His research covers all facets of pediatric general and health literacy and applies cutting edge tools such as MRI to explore how a home reading environment and interventions promoting reading aloud during early childhood help build critical brain networks. Many of the books he's authored were inspired by his experience as a father of three, fueling deep passion for reading aloud and an "analog" childhood — the kind with limited screen time and lots of human engagement and free play.

READ ACROSS AMERICA DAY RECAP

The National Education Association created Read Across America Day as a way of motivating children and teens to read through events, partnerships, and providing reading resources with a unique theme each year. 2022's theme was diversity and inclusion.

On March 2nd, The Literacy Cooperative and 21 partners showcased local diverse authors through virtual story times and author spotlights. Our partners hosted events and we led a photo campaign on social media using **#CLEReads2022** and **#ReadAcrossAmerica** hashtags. The 2022 campaign was a great success with more than 5,000 impressions on Twitter and 800 on Facebook and YouTube.



THE KURT KARAKUL LITERACY AWARD

With a gift from The Third Federal Foundation, The Literacy Cooperative created The Kurt Karakul Literacy Award to annually recognize an organization doing exemplary work to advance literacy in the community. Beginning this year, The Literacy Cooperative will annually award \$20,000 to a non-profit or public service organization in Cuyahoga County that embodies Kurt's passion for literacy and his conviction to make a difference in others' lives.



For decades, Kurt Karakul has been a leading voice for literacy in our community and his achievements have been profound. As President and Executive Director of the Third Federal Foundation, Mr. Karakul was instrumental in helping design a cradle-to-career program called the Slavic Village P-16. This initiative increased the number of quality pre-K seats tenfold and raised the percentage of third graders passing the standardized reading test from 50% to 92%.

To know Kurt Karakul is to know a man of empathy and good will. A man who understands the benefits and opportunities that literacy gives us. A man who has made the cause of literacy his cause. This award, which rightfully bears his name, was established to recognize and support the next generation of "Kurts" in our community.

2022 KURT KARAKUL LITERACY AWARD WINNER

The Literacy Cooperative is pleased to announce that Seeds of Literacy (Seeds) was selected as the inaugural recipient of The Kurt Karakul Literacy Award and its \$20,000 cash prize. Seeds was chosen for their exemplary work in advancing adult literacy. According to the Program for the International Assessment of Adult Competencies (PIAAC), 54% of adults in Cuyahoga County are less than proficient in literacy. The work of Seeds emulates the values for which this award was established.

"This Kurt Karakul Literacy Award is designed to encourage the next generation of literacy advocates while at the same time honoring a man who has made such a profound impact on our children and our community," says Robert Paponetti, President and CEO of The Literacy Cooperative.

Seeds has a long history of success educating Greater Clevelanders. This year, the organization is celebrating its 25th anniversary! Seeds provides individualized tutoring to adult students. The majority of students are working towards a GED, others simply want to learn how to read. A team of nearly 300 tutors and 24 staff members educate more than 1,000 students every year, at two Cleveland locations and a Virtual Classroom. While the majority of students are single mothers of color, Seeds serves a diverse group of individuals. Seeds students come from all different backgrounds and experiences but share a singular goal: to improve their education. Seeds has developed many community partnerships to enhance the impact of its program. Working with local colleges, workforce programs, and training providers, Seeds helps its students plan for their future and take the next step after earning their GED.

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
